20 CPD points per year.

Self-recorded. AICD audits members at renewal time (retain certificates).

Program replaced the DPD units system from October 2025.

There is a maximum of 10 CPD points which can be claimed per year for professional reading, including both AICD and third-party reading. This cap is worth noting.

How to record this program

AICD CPD is self-assessed and broadly defined.

External governance, strategy, risk and regulatory programs qualify where they are relevant to contemporary directorship.

This program directly addresses the APRA board literacy obligations declared in April 2026 — making it directly responsive to a current regulatory expectation of directors.

Record your attendance via the AICD member portal and retain your certificate of attendance.

40 hours per year (licensee's CPD year). an additional minimum of 5 hours in tax (financial) advice for tax practitioners

Mandatory categories include: technical competence, client care and practice, regulatory compliance and consumer protection, professionalism and ethics, and general CPD.

At least 70% must be qualifying CPD approved by the AFS licensee. Records must be kept and provided to licensee on request.

How to record this program

AI governance and regulation map directly to the regulatory compliance and consumer protection category — one of the mandatory categories under the Determination.

Content on data provenance and IP maps to technical competence.

Governance and ethics sessions map to professionalism and ethics.

Present this guide to your AFS licensee for approval of qualifying CPD status.

Retain your certificate of attendance.

- Professionalism & Ethics

Note: The AFS licensee must approve at least 70% of the 40 hours as qualifying CPD — meaning the licensee's approval gate applies to qualifying CPD, not that 70% of all hours must be approved. Evidence of attendance must be retained and logged in the RMIA online portal. RMIA audits members regularly.

Activities must extend knowledge in the area of HR practice and contribute to professional capabilities.

AI in workforce planning, hiring algorithms, performance monitoring and workforce transformation maps directly to AHRI's CPD categories covering workforce design, technology and people management practice.

The workforce session alone is a primary hook, but governance, data and risk sessions all contribute to contemporary HR knowledge.

IPA: 120 CPD hours over a three year period

All bodies require content to be relevant to professional competence.

How to record this program

AI in audit, financial modelling, fraud detection, client advisory and regulatory compliance is directly relevant to the professional competence of accountants.

CA ANZ explicitly notes that CPD activities are not restricted to accounting topics — if the activity is structured, educational and enhances your ability to do your job, it counts.

This program qualifies as verifiable CPD.

Content must satisfy the objective of maintaining and extending competence.

Records must be maintained for at least 12 months after the activity.

1 CIP point = 1 hour of professional development.

How to record this program

AI in underwriting, claims automation, fraud detection and liability exposure for AI failures are live commercial issues directly relevant to insurance practice.

Sessions 01, 03 and 04 address technical knowledge relevant to insurance and finance — contributing toward the 15 technical points requirement.

Log points in your ANZIIF Learning Portfolio and retain your certificate of attendance as audit Evidence for up to 24 months.

IAPP CIPP/A, CIPM and CIPT holders must complete 20 CPD hours per two-year certification period to maintain credentials.

Content must be relevant to privacy, data protection or information governance.

IAPP uses a self-reporting model.

Records should be retained for potential audit.

CPD can include structured learning events, conferences and professional development programs.

How to record this program

This program is among the most directly relevant CPD available to privacy professionals in Australia right now.

The Privacy Act automated decision-making obligations (foreshadowed for December 2026) make AI policy a core privacy compliance issue.

Sessions 01 (data provenance), 03 (regulatory compliance) and 02 (governance) are directly within the privacy professional's domain.

All sessions are relevant to the intersection of AI and privacy law.

Log hours with IAPP via your certification dashboard and retain your certificate of attendance.

All four mandatory fields are covered across the full program.

If your provider offers a post-session assessment quiz, it qualifies as Group 2 and yields 14 credits — a significantly stronger return on a single day.

Activity must be relevant to your scope of practice and documented with a reflection on how it affects your practice.
